## Property Tax Deductions

A deduction of \$250 is available to those residents age 65 years of age or older, who have owned their homes since October first of the previous tax year, lived in the state for two years and whose income (excluding Social Security or other similar government pension) does not exceed \$10,000. For additional information, call your local Tax Assessor's Office.

## Cleanout & Move-out Fees

Contents from entire cleanout of dwellings cannot be put at curb until a fee of \$250 is paid to the Township of Berkeley and arrangements for collection have been made with the Department of Public Works. Mattresses must be enclosed in bags.

These activities would have to be attractive to our residents, financially attainable and need the support of new volunteers to participate and run. I am open to realistic ideas, reasonably priced activities, from the community.

## Dues Assessments

The first-quarter dues payment of 2026 are due on January 1st. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the 1st of the next month if dues are not paid on time. Association dues assessments are payable on or before the first day of a given quarter. To ensure that your dues payments are posted correctly, your payment must be accompanied by a dues coupon containing all of the required information. Be sure your information is legible. Payments may be sent to the Clubhouse by mail, brought to the Treasurer's office or placed in the dues box on the main floor of the Clubhouse. **Dues coupons are available at the Clubhouse and are published in The Sentinel.**

As a homeowner, your obligation to pay dues continues as long as you own your home and it is the homeowner's obligation to pay dues for renters. Individuals residing in your home with you on a permanent basis ("permanent" defined as a stay of more than 90 days) must be 19 years of age or older and are obligated to abide by the Association's governing documents. Also, remember, if you own more than one home, each property is subject to dues.

# Dues Coupons

January 1, 2026 homeowners dues are \$72 per quarter per living unit. Payments are to be made at the beginning of the quarter. January 1, 2026, April 1, 2026, July 1, 2026 and October 1, 2026. If you pay semi annually the payment would be \$144 on January 1, 2026 and July 1, 2026. Annual payments are \$288 due on January 1, 2026. Make checks payable to Silver Ridge Park West Homeowners Association and mail or drop off in the mail slot at the Clubhouse, 145 Westbrook Dr., Toms River, N.J. 08757

Note: All payments must be accompanied by a fully completed dues coupon. A late fee of \$15 will be added to your account on the first of the next month after the due date if dues are not paid on time.



Meeting Minutes

January 12, 2026

Richard Laird, President: Good evening, everyone. Please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pat Lima, Opening Prayer:

Virginia Sansone, Roll Call: President. Here, Vice President is absent, Secretary is here. Section 5 is here, Section 6. Here. Section 7. Here, Section 8 is absent. Section 9. Here, Section 10, Here, Section 11, absent.

Richard Laird, President: Tonight's meeting is being held in accordance with the Silver Ridge Park West Governing Documents and Roberts Rules of Order, 12th edition. Notice that this meeting was announced in the Sentinel, posted on the Silver Ridge Park West website and posted on the Clubhouse door. Earlier, I handed out the December minutes. Motion to accept the minutes? Second. All in favor? Aye. Opposed? So, let me go over a couple things tonight. First of all, nobody volunteered to do the treasurer's position. We hired our Office of Administrative Assistance. The woman that we hired as our office administrator, we specifically hired her for her background in business, accounting, bookkeeping, ordering, inventory, budgeting, and 15 years' experience in a major manufacturing corporation. She's basically an expert in QuickBooks Pro and Excel worksheets. So that everybody understands, the state of New Jersey does not require any certifications or licensing for an HOA Treasurer. Our bylaws don't require anybody to be bonded, so if we want to do that, we must change the bylaws to have somebody bonded. So, being that she is not a resident, she cannot attend the meetings and has no vote on the Board. She will be available at 2:30, the day of the HOA meeting, to do a presentation on financials. I'll continue the treasurer report at the meeting to present the financials.

Because of insurance reasons, that any of our events that the clubs have over 100 people, they must have additional insurance. Our insurance rep is very specific on the number 100, and most of the events, unfortunately, that the community event group holds are over 100 people. So, the insurance for them would be over \$400 each event. So basically, that would just end profits or anything they would get. So, we are going to bring the community events club under the HOA, under the Recreation Committee. The HOA will now have the jurisdiction over funding. So, we'll be able to expand that. So, I think it's a plus for us. We have documentation from the Attorney General's office to apply for a gaming license under

our 501c7. Specifically, senior communities can now apply for a gaming license. So, we are going to apply for a gaming license. It opens the door for us to hold bigger events. All the treasury stuff, all the bookkeeping stuff, any monies in their accounts, that all fall now under the HOA.

Rules and regulations. There's been discussion about changing the garden fencing rules and regulations. I'll turn that over to Debbie to do so that the board could vote on any changes that she wants.

Debi Tobia: The only change on the garden and fencing, which is temporary fencing, is to make it unified. Not making a fence in your backyard with it. So, I went with two sizes, which were 44-inch high and 48-inch high. If you have a taller tree or bush that you want to protect. In the front, in the side, and in the back. So that's what I put forth. Just to clarify, we're talking about the wrought iron, no-dig fences. This was already in the rules. I'm not asking anybody to change anything. I'm just asking for people to make it more unified.

Richard Laird: Okay, let's do a roll call vote.

Marybeth: Yes. But are we also saying this temporary fencing can be up year-round? Yes. Then I'm for that just black with exception. Brian: I vote yes with exception that all wrought iron. Debi: I'm for it. And I'm for different colors. Because each person has their own personality with their homes. Virginia: yes. Shirleyann: Yes, and colors. Tom: Yes

Richard Laird: I'm against it. Let me just state my reasons why. The fencing around here is out of control now. I mean, there's yards fenced in, houses fenced in, there's cloth fencing. If we don't get that under control first before we change, we'll never get it back. So, I just don't see how it's going to be enforced. So, my answer is no.

One, two, three, four, five, six yeses and one no. We have two colors. I say black. Okay. So, it's one, two, three, four. Without, no color. So, then it'll be just black. Okay. And so, everybody understands the rules and regulations,

We do have a property assessor coming around. We received several calls on it. They do have the right to come around. They all have identifications on them. They are going to come to look at your house. They're going to walk around your property. You do not have to let them in your house if you do not want to. Now, if you want to let them in your house and you want to have somebody there with you, you can make an appointment to have them come in. But you do not have to let them in your house. We have positively zero say in this matter. This is something being done as required by the state. Every resident received a notification from the Berkeley County Tax Assessor. And this is all going to be done by the end of this year or so. Unfortunately, we can probably look at a tax increase for 2027. So, you know, there's not much we can do about it.

Our bylaws do not mean anything when it comes to solicitors. The Township ordinances supersede our bylaws. So, if a solicitor comes in and the township gives them permission to solicit, they're allowed to solicit even though our bylaws say no. They're allowed to solicit between the hours of 11 and 3. Now, the only way you can stop somebody from knocking on your door is called a no-knock form. You can fill that out online on the Berkeley Township website. We have it in the Sentinel.

Just a reminder that the February homeowners' association meets at 3 o'clock next month. HOPA forms are due again. I know nobody wants to hear this. It's an even year, HOPA forms are due. This is the biggest thing, and I cannot stress this enough to people. If we do not have a HOPA form, if we do not have 80% of the people registered as 55-plus in this community, we have the opportunity of losing our 55-plus designation, causing a tax increase. The state of New Jersey is looking at every HOA 55-plus community and trying to figure out how to take it over. It must be done every two years.

Virginia: If you have anything that's going to go into the Sentinel, I must receive it by the 9th. If I do not have it by the 9th, it will not go into the next edition as the publisher gave us deadlines.

Richard Laird: Under the Treasurer's report, financials were handed out so we need the motion to accept. Can we get a first motion? Second? All in favor? Aye. Opposed? motion accepted. Financials accepted. Regarding dues, everybody that's behind in dues a year or more is getting notifications that their dues are due. There's a lot of confusion over the increase of \$36. One of the biggest things we're encountering, people don't read the Sentinel. Any residents that doesn't respond to us or work with us, we will be placing a lien on their property. If you need to make some kind of agreement, we're willing. At the last meeting, we had over \$72,000 in outstanding dues. We're down to, like, 65 now.

We also had our audit. We passed our audit, so thank you to the audit committee that did that work for us. That was all done two weeks ago.

Trustee Reports: Mary Beth: I got a phone call from somebody that said that they and their neighbor on their ring door captured somebody lurking around their homes at about 1130 or 12 o'clock at night. I did advise them that they should call Berkeley police.

Brian: Nothing to report.

Debi: Nothing to report.

Shirley: I was disappointed with the town with the last snowstorm.

Richard Laird: We had a meeting with the Mayor & Shawn, the public works director, the councilman, and the councilwoman. All the complaints were all the same from all ten HOAs.

Toms: Nothing to report.

Women's Club, Maria: So, the Christmas party was good. We had DJ Anthony here. It was a lot of fun. And then in partnership with the Men's Club, we had a fantastic New Year's Eve party. We got many rave reviews from the attendees. The band was good. We had our January potluck meeting. We're going to have our annual Mother's Day Tea. It's scheduled for May at the Mathis House. We're going to go to Ocean County Vocational Tech School, as we always do. Have lunch courtesy of the students in the Culinary Program. And new residents are always welcome.

Men's Club, Tom: Yeah. Thanks, Maria, for covering our New Year's Eve. It was a great party. And we plan on having the same thing happen next year. We meet on the third Wednesday of every month; we have our meeting downstairs. Our dues for the New Year's went up to \$15,

ADR, Jim: I'm trying to get in touch with the other two people that are interested in the ADR also.

Codes, there's nothing on the codes. Common ground, nothing. If a tree is laying down on the ground and it's in the common grounds, for now it's staying there. I'm not worried about cleaning up in the area back there right now until springtime. I know off Northumberland between 80 and 88, we probably have at least a dozen trees about 12 inches in diameter down, look like straight winds swept through.

Election Committee, Diane: We're meeting this week.

Neighborhood Watch, Virginia: Nothing except what I am hearing here.

## ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Control Committee is a standing committee and operates under the guidance of the SRPW HOA By-Laws, Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, and Rules and Regulations.

According to Article V, Section 1 of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions: No building or other structure, fence, wall, swimming pool or any other structure, either of a permanent or temporary character, shall be erected, moved on, installed, commenced or maintained, upon the properties nor shall any exterior addition to or alteration be made to any existing building or structure unless the plans and specifications thereof, showing the nature, kind, shape, height, materials and location of same, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony, as to exterior design, and location of surrounding structures and topography, by the Architectural Control Committee of the Association which shall consist of either (1) The Board of Trustees of the Association, or (2) a committee composed of not less than three (3) persons appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Association.

Process by the Committee Members:

1. Provide HOA paperwork and assist homeowner with preparation of same.
2. Do preliminary site survey and discuss with homeowner planned improvements.
3. Collect homeowner's completed paperwork.
4. Present paperwork to HOA officers for approval and be available to discuss with officers.
5. Collect officer's signatures for approval.
6. Provide homeowner with copies of approval to proceed.
7. Maintain contact with homeowner.
8. Resident to contact Architectural Control upon completion of job Review project upon completion.
9. Return completed paperwork to HOA office for the permanent files.
10. Maintain tracking worksheet with progress.

Violations of the HOA Covenants and Restrictions:

1. STOP WORK order to cease work in progress
2. Delay in approval of proposed work
3. Possible non-approval of proposed work
4. Fines by the HOA for non-compliance, not to exceed \$100 per violation
5. Fines by Berkeley Township for code violations

## Berkeley Township Construction Permits

No construction permit shall be issued for the alteration of the exterior of any residence or addition to such residence, or construction of accessory structures located within any planned residential retirement community, unless the application for such permit is accompanied by a written statement issued by the association organized under subsection 35-101.12 of this section, indicating whether the association has approved the proposed improvement. In the absence of such approval the Construction Official may if otherwise required to issue the permit pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code note on the permit that the applicant must obtain such approval before beginning construction.

# Watch for this scam involving Amazon QR codes and packages, NJ police warn

The scam involves unsolicited packages containing a malicious QR code delivered to homes. Scanning the code can lead to malware being installed on the recipient's phone, along with identity theft and stolen financial information.

The deception starts with the delivery of an item, often in "what appears to be legitimate Amazon packaging," police said. The package may have the resident's correct name and address but no clear return address or other information on the sender.

The delivery generally includes a note with a QR code for the recipient to scan. The note may feature enticing messages for the resident such as "Find out who sent the gift" or "Claim a prize," or offering a reward in exchange for leaving a five-star review.

Scanning the code may redirect users to a fraudulent website designed to look like an official Amazon or bank login page that prompts them to enter personal or financial information. It could also download malicious software onto the electronic device, allowing scammers access to personal data, passwords and accounts.

Police urge residents not to scan QR codes from unsolicited packages or enter private information on unknown websites. The public should also report suspicious deliveries directly to Amazon and monitor financial accounts for any unusual activity.

Residents who believe they may have been targeted or victimized by the scam are asked to contact the Berkeley Township Police Department immediately.



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

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
